Your Transition Advisory Team has been busy this summer working to support the community through this challenging time. I would like to take the opportunity to report on our progress and where we go from here.

Over the last several weeks, we have met with community, business and municipal leaders, representatives from the forestry industry, the local chambers of commerce, and Lunenburg-Queens Regional Development Agency.

We have relayed various concerns over worker pensions, re-training, fire, water supply and safety at the Bowater mill and wood supply issues to the province and other agencies. I believe we have served as an important link between the region and the province during these difficult weeks just past.

One of the important themes we have been hearing in our discussions so far is the need to access training. I want to strongly encourage all individuals impacted by the Bowater mill closure and interested in re-training to visit your local career counselling centre. NSCC and the province can respond with specialized training or additional courses, provided there is sufficient interest. More discussions are planned with stakeholder groups over the next few weeks, but equally as important, we want to hear from the general public.
